(5) The representation of an embroidered umbrella over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's are the Chinese characters 輝華麵粉公司 (meaning "Fisher Flouring Mills Company"); on the right hand side of the embroidered umbrella are the Chinese characters 好筋白麵粉 (meaning "Good strength white flour") on the left hand side the Chinese characters 羅傘牌 為記 (meaning "Embroidered umbrella mark") and below the words "Long Shan Brand Flour".
(6) The representation of a Gourd pierced through the neck by a sword over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's are the Chinese characters 輝華麵粉公司 (meaning "Fisher Flouring Mills Company"); on the right hand side of the Gourd are the Chinese characters 幼白好筋 (meaning "Fine, white and good strength") on the left hand side the Chinese characters 葫蘆為記 (meaning "Gourd mark") and below the words "Gourd and Sword Brand Flour".
(7) The representation of a Chinese curio over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's

are the Chinese characters 輝華  
麵粉公司 (meaning "Fisher  
Flouring Mills Company"); on the  
right hand side of the curio are the  
Chinese characters 幼白麵粉  
(meaning "Fine and white flour")  
on the left hand side the Chinese  
characters 八寶爲記 (meaning  
"Eight Precious things mark") and  
below the words "Pat Po Brand  
Flour".

(8) The representation of a Chinese banner over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's are the Chinese characters 輝華 麵粉公司 (meaning "Fisher Flouring Mills Company"); on the right hand side of the banner are the Chinese characters 幼白好筋麵粉 (meaning "Fine, white and good strength flour") on the left hand side the Chinese characters 得勝牌爲記 (meaning "Winner's banner mark") and below the words "Shui Fai Brand Flour".

(9) The representation of a Safe over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's are the Chinese characters 輝華麵粉公司 (meaning "Fisher Flouring Mills Company"); on the right hand side of the safe are the Chinese characters 好筋麵粉 (meaning "Good strength flour") and on the left hand side the Chinese characters 夾萬記爲 (meaning "Safe Mark"); under the safe are the words "Safe" and "Flour" and below the words "Safe Flour".

(10) The representation of a Dish containing fourteen eggs with a large piece of ginger root lying on top of them over which appears the word "Fisher's" written in a distinctive fashion and above the word Fisher's are the Chinese characters 輝華
