Alteration in position of South-East Spit Gas-lighted Buoy.

REFERRING to Special Notice to Mariners No. 376, notice is hereby given that the South-east Spit Gas-lighted Buoy has been moved, and is now moored in 29 feet of water at low water of spring tides. From the Buoy, Leo Point Beacon bears N. 46° W. (magnetic), distant 4.86 miles.

The characteristics of the Buoy remain unchanged.
