**NOTICES TO MARINERS.**

**STRAITS SETTLEMENTS.**

THE attention of masters of vessels leaving for ports in the Straits Settlements is called to the following Straits Settlements Quarantine Rule:—

“The importation of the following susceptible objects or merchandise from Plague-infected ports is prohibited:—

- (a.) Body linen, wearing apparel, clothing and bedding which has been used, (except when conveyed as baggage in which case entry may be permitted subject to such precautions as to disinfection being taken as the Port Health Officer may direct);
- (b.) Rags and shoddy, including rags compressed by hydraulic power and conveyed as merchandise in bales;
- (c.) Embroidery, rags and sacks which have been used and carpets;
- (d.) Raw hides and fresh untanned skins;
- (e.) Fresh remains of animals, hoofs, hair, felt, raw silk and wool;
- (f.) Hair of all kinds.”

**KOBE HARBOUR REGULATIONS.**

THE Kobe Harbour Office has issued a circular to the local steamship agents, requesting them to inform shipmasters that all steamers coming from or *viâ* Indian ports, Singapore, Hongkong, Bangkok, Java, Amoy and Canton, with the exception of those having certificates from the competent authorities showing that operations for the destruction of rats by means of sulphur-fumes or gas have been carried out within the three months preceding arrival at Kobe, shall until further notice carry out such operations at Kobe.

Kobe steamship agents have also been informed that in future no quarantine inspection will be carried out after 9 p.m., even on mail steamers or other vessels which urgently require to pass quarantine. Further, quarantine inspection will not be carried out after sunset on vessels which lie outside the harbour limits.

**COLONIAL SECRETARY'S DEPARTMENT.**

**No. S. 275.**—Notice is hereby given that the Governor-in-Council purposes to make an order under the Highways Ordinance No. 21 of 1910, for entirely stopping up the following streets or portions of streets or projected streets :—
