No. S. 365.—It is hereby notified that information has been received from the Military Authorities that Gun Practice will be carried out as under:—

From the North-East side of Stonecutters Island, in a Westerly direction, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m.

On Tuesday, the 29th October:—

From Stonecutters Island, in a South-Westerly direction, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.*

On Wednesday, the 30th October:—

“Night Practice”, from Lyemun, in a Northerly direction, between the hours of 7 p.m. and 11 p.m.

On Thursday, the 31st October:—

From Mount Davis, in a Westerly direction, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.*

On Friday, the 1st November:—

From Belchers Battery, in a Westerly direction, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.*

* If the range is clear practice will probably be completed by 2 p.m. each day.

All ships, junks and other vessels are to keep clear of the ranges.
