No. S. 281.—The Public Works Department is prepared to receive Tenders for the purchase of the following materials:—

- (a.) 10 Nos. M.S. pontoons each 12' × 5' × 4' in good condition, along with a quantity of steel channel bars, bolts and gusset plates now lying at Causeway Bay Depot;
- (b.) 2 No. similar pontoons now lying in the yard of the Taikoo Dockyard and Engineering Co., Quarry Bay.

The material can be seen at the places mentioned above, and, as each lot must be taken as it lies, intending offerers are requested to inspect same before tendering.

Tenders may be for all or any portion of the material specified, but EACH LOT MUST BE OFFERED FOR SEPARATELY.

Delivery will be made free at the place where the material is lying. All cartage charges to be paid by the purchaser.
