Opium.—Large arrivals. Sale of Siam in barter for Opium at 85 per picul. Also a large quantity of Cochin-China at 84 per picul.

Orum.—The second sales of the season took place in Calcutta on the 27th Dec. and average Coy's Ra. 901 for Patna and 912 for Benares.

On receipt of the news prices here fell to 4410 Benares at which a good deal was sold; 10 days quotation is 4430 and not much doing. 25 chests Patna were placed at 4455 per chest a slight demand for Turkey sprang up some days ago and 24 chests were sold at 4440 per picul; the stock is now reduced to 10 or 12 chests.

Pepper, Black.—Abundant. Singapore selling at 43.45 a 3.53 and Rho at 43.33 per picul. White—wanted. Long—no supplies.

Rice.—Declining. 153 coynas Siam—yests placed early in the Month at 457 and 120 coynas new Arracan, etc. at 447. Prices are now lower and the latter is offering at 44.4 per cent.

Rattans.—Continue current at 413 a 2 1/2 for Straits and 42 per picul for Benjamens.

Raw Silk.—The demand is confined to a chest or two at a time at 4285 per picul.

Sugar.—4,000 piculs Siam were bartered at 454 early in the month for *Grey Strivings* and *Tint* rather over current rates, and a few baskets of Java have been placed at 85 per picul. Siam in now offering in quantity without finding purchasers.

Sago, Manila.—Stocks large. We hear of sales of No. 3 at 89 a 94 and No. 4 at 87 a 8 per Mil.

Sapan Wood.—Sale of 2,700 piculs, fair quality, by Auction at 1.95 a 2 per picul.
