PROCLAMATION.

No. 14 of 1868, entitled—*An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, to apply a Sum not exceeding Eight hundred and Thirty-seven thousand Dollars to the Public Service of the Year 1869:*

Now, therefore, it is hereby declared, that the said Ordinance has been so approved and confirmed, as aforesaid.
