SUPREME COURT.

No. 35.—It is hereby notified that, by command of His Excellency the Governor, and pursuant to Section 8 of The Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, (No. 1 of 1903) as amended by Section 3 of The Public Health and Buildings Amendment Ordinance, 1903, (No. 23 of 1903), an Election by the Rate-payers of two Members to the Sanitary Board will take place at the City Hall on Monday, the 22nd of January, commencing at 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

The following persons will be entitled to vote at the election, that is to say:—

- (a.) Rate-payers who are included in the Special and Common Jury Lists for the year 1905.
- (b.) Rate-payers who are exempted from serving on Juries on account of their professional avocations.

The election will be conducted in accordance with the Rules contained in Schedule C to the above named Ordinance.

Voting will commence immediately after the nomination and continue until 6 p.m., when the ballot-box will be closed.

No Rate-payer will be allowed to vote unless he produces to the undersigned the receipt for the Rates paid by him for the month of December, 1905, or otherwise satisfies the undersigned that he is a Rate-payer.
