From Boa Vista on to Mount Collison and Tytam Bay, at ranges up to 8,000 yards, commencing at 10 a.m., and finishing at 1 p.m.

If the weather is unfavourable on either of the above dates, practice will take place on the following day.

All ships, junks and other vessels are to keep clear of the ranges.
