CIRCULAR.

DOWNING STREET,
9th February, 1906.

SIR,—With reference to my Predecessor's Circular despatch of the 24th November last, I have the honour to inform you that the Senate of the University of London have recently had under consideration the question of the conditions under which their practical examinations may be sanctioned at Colonial Centres, and I transmit herewith* for your information extracts from a letter written by the Principal of the University in connection

with an application from Ceylon, indicating the arrangements which it is considered necessary to make for these examinations. I enclose also copies of two letters from Sir A. RÜCKER respecting an application from Malta, from which you will gather the considerations which influence the University authorities in acceding to, or refusing to comply with, an application for the holding of practical examinations in a Colony, and the nature of the apparatus with which the laboratories to be used should be equipped.
