Manila.	Hongkong vessels may bring steerage passengers, and, if health of Hongkong satisfactory, can proceed direct to Manila after 1st November. Fresh vegetables prohibited.	16th October, 1902.	No. 66C.
Newchwang.	Importation of rags, waste paper, hair, earth and manure from Hongkong prohibited.	4th October, 1904.	No. 684
Siam.	Medical Inspection at Kohphra against arrivals from Hongkong.	14th Sept., 1905.	No. 576.

Netherlands India.	Arrivals from Hongkong, or vessels having called there, are subject to five days' quarantine from date of departure or of last plague case on board. Importation is temporarily prohibited of animal refuse, claws and hoofs, animal or human hair and bristles, untanned hides and hides salted or cured with arsenic, raw wool and rags, bags or sacks which have already been used, coming from or transhipped at Hongkong; also tapestry and used embroideries unless they are transported as personal baggage or in consequence of change of residence.	16th Feb., 1906.
