Amendment of Scavenging and Conservancy Bye-laws made under Section 16 of the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, (Ordinance No. 1 of 1903), and published in the Government Gazette on the 18th March, 1904.

Bye-law No. 4 is hereby amended by deleting the full stop at the end thereof and substituting a colon and adding the following words:—"in the case of bake-houses, dairies, laundries, opium divans, and premises used for offensive trades, such dust bins shall be constructed of impervious materials to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Board."
