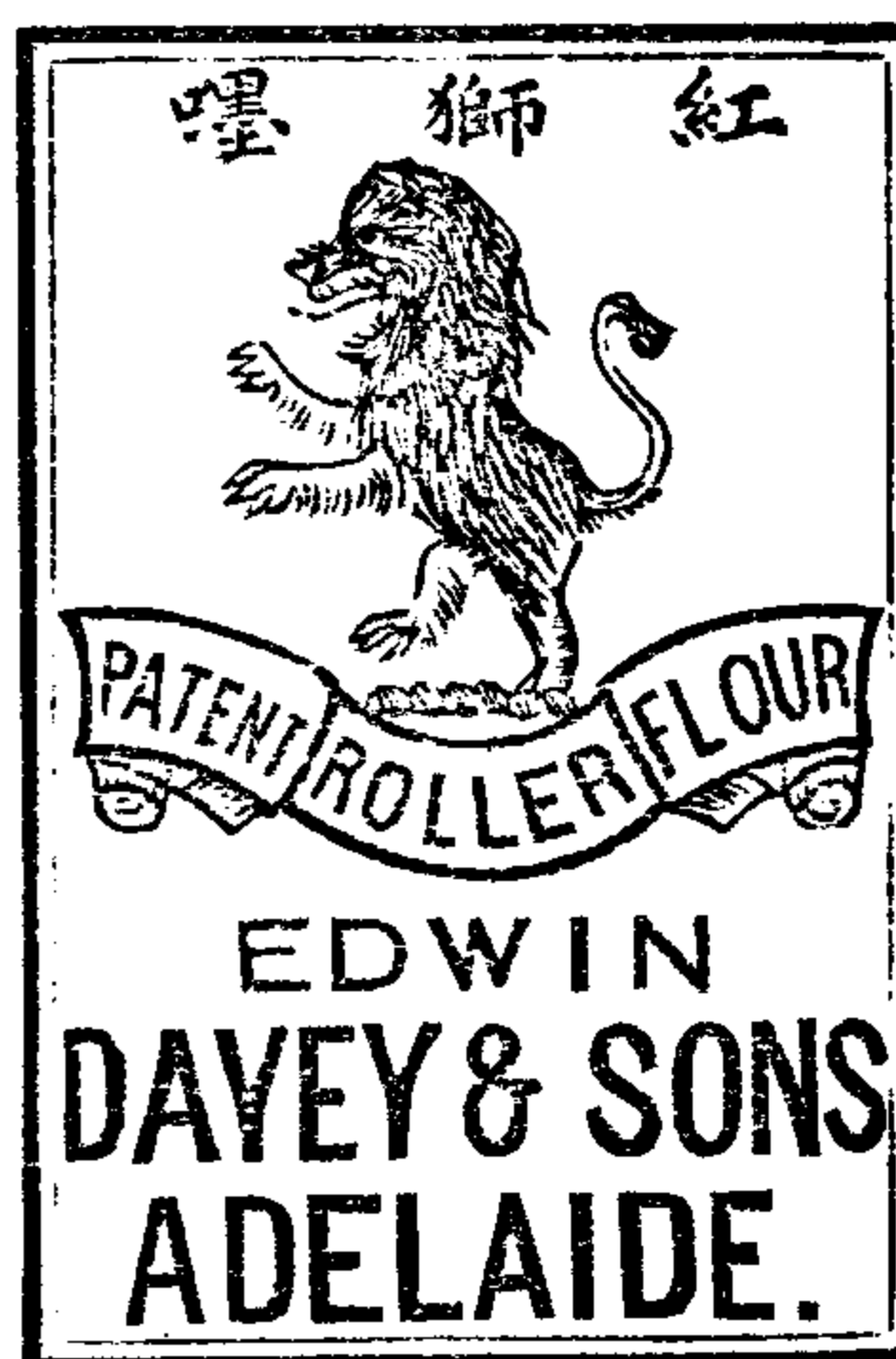

The representation of four men sitting at a table upon which is a variety of articles or curio spread, one of the men at the head of the table is holding up to his mouth as if he was about to drink from it a cup, whilst another man is holding in his left hand another cup the third man is holding in his hands a piece of coral like a branch of a tree and the fourth man is holding a tray with a round box on it, to the right of the table are two men each in charge of a horse and cart and another man is in the act of receiving from one of these men who are in charge of the horses the contents of his cart, above is written in Chinese characters the words (五路進寶) meaning "presentation of valuables by five states", and the whole picture is surrounded with a floral border.

2. An artistic design having a background of lily flowers with leaves, in the centre of the design is a scroll upon which, in the centre, the words (進寶圖) appear in Chinese characters meaning "the design of a tributary gift of valuables", on the left also in Chinese characters appear the words (魯鱗) whilst on the right the words (洋行) in Chinese characters also appear meaning "Reuter Bröckelmann and Company", each side of the scroll appears the design of an article known as "U Yee" (如意) meaning "as one pleases generally," made of jade stone and the holders of them are crossed beneath the scroll and also beneath the scroll appears the representation of a heart above which is the figure four the whole picture is surrounded with a fancy design of blossoms and leaves.

3. The representation of a Chinese literati and two Chinese girls the literati has a scholar's cap on his head and is sitting on a stone seat outside a pavilion surrounded with a wooden fence with his left arm resting on the fence holding his beard with his right hand and he is looking at a young girl who is kneeling before him, to the left of the literati is another Chinese girl standing upright in front of some bamboos growing on one side of the pavilion, with her arms crossed resting on one or two rocks between which the first mentioned girl is kneeling and in the distance may be seen a rocky hill and above the hill is written (儒林詩婢庚子三月中浣之吉良村朱梓作於海上) in Chinese characters meaning "Poetesses amongst the literati" Done by CHU TSZE alias LEONG CHOY while at sea the lucky day middle decade 3rd moon Kang Tsze (year) and a seal also in Chinese characters (i.e. the seal of the artist or writer)

4. The representation of a Chinaman of high rank sitting on a chair on a raised platform behind which stand two Chinese women with large fans in their hands standing around the platform are 8 Chinamen one of whom is holding by one of its fore legs an angry horse which is standing on its hind legs prancing in front of the platform above the picture in Chinese

characters appear the words (伏馬圖) meaning "the picture of the subduing of a horse", and also (魯麟洋行) meaning "Reuter Bröckelmann and Company" the whole picture is surrounded with a fancy design.

5. The representation of a Chinese General kneeling down with his left hand resting on a large urn and in his right hand he is holding a sword aloft in front next to the urn is a pig's head on a tray and another Chinese General is standing to see what the other General is doing with the urn and pig's head, on the left is a table at which a Chinese prince with a cup on the table in front of him is sitting, and to his left stands a Chinese official and to his right a Chinese soldier armed with a sword in its sheath on the right is also a table at which is sitting another Chinese Prince holding a cup with his left hand and to his right hand stands a Chinaman (who is supposed to be his adviser) holding in his left a staff tipped with long hairs whilst a Chinese soldier armed with a sword in its sheath is standing at the foot of the table pointing with his left hand at the Generals above the picture are written in Chinese characters the words (鴻門夜宴屈綺霞繪) meaning "a night dinner at Chung Moon painted by WAY YEE HA" and below the picture appear the words (魯麟洋行) also in Chinese characters meaning "Reuter Bröckelmann and Company".

6. The representation of a fancy wood-stand upon which is a tall vase of artistic design resting on a pedestal and containing a water lily plant in flower and a Chinese plant known as "Kwai" which is according to the Chinese and English Dictionary Olea fragrans to the left of the vase also on the fancy wood stand is a dish resting on a pedestal and containing pomegranates above which are written the words (蓮榴子桂) in Chinese characters meaning "un-interrupted line of illustrious sons", the whole is surrounded with a fancy border.

7. The representation of a Chinaman of high rank standing on some steps of an altar or elevated structure with a bench of authority on it, holding in his two hands a document from which he is reading, in front of the steps on the back of the document appear the words (聖旨) in Chinese characters meaning "Emperor or King's decree", and to the left is a banner on which appear the words (三軍司命) in Chinese characters meaning "Commander-in-Chief of the three armies", to the left is a Chinaman on horse back behind whom are three soldiers the first holding aloft a spear the second an umbrella and the third a banner immediately behind which is flying another banner on which appears the word (韓) in Chinese character being the Chinese surname "Hon" to the right also in front are eleven soldiers kneeling down looking up at the Chinaman who is on horse back above the picture in Chinese characters are written (國士無雙) meaning "a learned citizen without an equal", whilst beneath the picture the words (魯麟洋行) in Chinese characters meaning "Reuter Bröckelmann and Company" appear.

8. The representation of a Chinese gentleman with a long beard sitting on a rock beneath a tree known as "Ng Tung" which according to the Chinese and English dictionary is dryandra cordifolia a jatropa cureas, with a Chinese stringed musical instrument known as "Kam" on his lap with his right hand resting on it and with his left hand quite open held up to his beard as if he was playing with it with his fingers and with a literati's cap on his head. To the right of the Chinaman is a sheet of water with water lily plants and a pair of swans in it. To the left is a Chinese boy holding aloft in his hands a branch of a plum tree and in front of the Chinaman are a few chrysanthemum plants with five flowers on them and a stork. The whole picture is surrounded with a fancy border in the upper part of which are printed the

words "Pat Oi To" (八愛圖)

in Chinese characters meaning "eight favourites picture" and in the lower part are printed the words "Poon ho ting tsik" (本號定織) in Chinese characters meaning "woven to the order of this firm".

9. The representation of a young Chinese gentleman sitting beneath the shade of 3 trees by the roadside his right hand is placing a bead on the centre of a board resting on the top of a rock with a receptacle on each side of the board whilst he is in the act of playing a game known amongst the Chinese as the "khemming in chess" with a Korean gentleman who is standing close by with the forefinger of his left hand pointing at the game above a little to the left of the players is written in Chinese characters (一子定中原) meaning "one bead secures the middle kingdom",
