From Lyemun S. Dt., towards Entrance to Junk Bay, at ranges up to 6,000 yards, commencing at 7 p.m., and finishing at 9.30 p.m.

On Thursday, the 22nd November:—

From Devils Peak, towards Waglan, at ranges up to 14,000 yards, commencing at 10 a.m., and finishing at 2 p.m.

On Friday, the 23rd November:—

From Lyemun S. Dt., towards Entrance to Junk Bay, at ranges up to 6,000 yards, commencing at 3 p.m., and finishing at 5 p.m.

On Monday, the 26th November:—

From Devils Peak, towards Waglan, at ranges up to 10,000 yards, commencing at 10 a.m., and finishing at 1 p.m.
