Whangpoo Conservancy work about to be undertaken on the left side of the channel at the Woosung Outer Bar.

NOTICE is hereby given that Conservancy work is about to be commenced along the left side of the channel at the Woosung Outer Bar, and, as a preliminary to such work, a number of piles will be driven about 300 feet apart along the south-eastern edge of the Woosung Spit.

From the easternmost of such piles a flag will be exhibited between sun-rise and sun-set and a red light between sun-set and sun-rise. Vessels, of whatever size, are cautioned against attempting to pass to the westward of either of these piles.
