

No. 56.—Instructions have been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies to the effect that the system of Priority Recommendations notified in Gazette Notification No. 227 of the 18th May, 1917, is no longer required as British manufacturers are now at liberty to proceed with orders without Priority Permits.

The Board of Trade will give assistance in any cases in which difficulties are experienced in placing or in execution of orders in the United Kingdom for machinery required for essential Colonial Industries.

Applications for assistance of the latter kind should be made to the Superintendent of Imports and Exports.
