The list which was published in the *Gazette* of the 21st July, 1916, of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited by the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, 1916, No. 3, and which has been amended by lists published in various *Gazettes*, is hereby further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto:—

NOTE (1).—All persons and firms resident or carrying on business within the Colony are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. The principal proclamation was published in the *Gazette* of the 21st July, 1916, and an amending proclamation was published in the *Gazette* of the 5th April, 1918.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of the 25th June and 10th November, 1915, all Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy apply to all persons or bodies of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa, and consequently it is an offence to trade with any person or body of persons of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa, even though such person or body of persons is not included by name in the Statutory List, and the omission of the name of any such person or body of persons from such list is not an authority or licence to trade with such person or body of persons.

NOTE (4).—The above additions and removals were made in the United Kingdom on the dates which appear opposite to the respective names.

NOTE (5).—A consolidating statutory list, complete to the 4th January, 1918, may be obtained from the Government Printers, Messrs. Noronha & Co., No. 14A, Des Vœux Road Central, who can also supply copies of the Orders in Council made since that date. The consolidating statutory list

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as “Handel Maatschappij” (Trading Company) or “Naamlooze Venootschap” (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term “Handel Maatschappij” or “Naamlooze Venootschap” (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij Louvre and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Freres will be found under Louvre and Komeet respectively, and not necessarily under “Handel” or “Naamlooze,” though cross references may be given.

Order made by the Officer Administering the Government in Council under sections 3 and 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, 1915, Ordinance No. 32 of 1915, on the 13th day of February, 1919.

The Schedule to Rule 41 of the rules made by the Governor in Council under the above Ordinance is amended by the transfer of the heading “Rubber” from Class (B) to Class (C).

NOTE (1).—Rule 41 was published in the *Gazette* of 31st January, 1919.

NOTE (2).—The effect of the above amendment of the Schedule is that the exportation of rubber is now prohibited to all destinations in European and Asiatic Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Portugal, Belgium, Greece, Spain, and Morocco. The exportation of rubber was formerly prohibited to all non-British destinations.
