SUPREME COURT.

No. 98.—It is hereby notified that, by command of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, and pursuant to the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, an Election of a Member to the Sanitary Board will take place at the City Hall on Monday, the 10th day of March, 1919, commencing at 4 o'clock in the afternoon.
