**No. 185.**

*Order made by the Officer Administering the Government in Council under sections 3 and 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, 1915, Ordinance No. 32 of 1915, on the 24th day of April, 1919.*

Rule 41 of the rules made by the Governor in Council under the above Ordinance and subsequently amended is further amended as follows:—

1. By the deletion of the word "and" between the words "Morocco" and "Palestine" and by the insertion of the words "Czecho-Slovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and the territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments" before the words "and to all ports" in paragraph (3).
2. By the transfer of the heading "Gambier" in the Schedule to the rule from Class (B) to Class (C).
