

Trading with the Enemy Amendment Ordinance, 1919.

No. 288.—It is hereby notified that, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Ordinance, 1919, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has made an order vesting in the Custodian all property, movable or immovable, of the following Missions or Missionary Societies, namely:—
