

## EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

No. 337.

*The Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1899, Ordinance No. 10 of 1899, Table L,  
Quarantine Regulations.*

It is hereby proclaimed by order of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Council that Foochow is a place at which an infectious or contagious disease prevails.

*Regulations made by the Officer Administering the Government in Council under section 4 of the Marine Stores Protection Ordinance, 1919, Ordinance No. 13 of 1919, on the 25th day of July, 1919.*

## Dealers in Marine Stores.

1. The fee for each licence to carry on the business of a dealer in Marine Stores shall be \$360 per annum payable by equal quarterly payments, each quarterly payment to be made in advance; and every licensee shall furnish a bond, with two sureties, in the sum of \$1,000 conditioned for the due observance by the licensee of the law affecting such dealers and for the performance and observance of the conditions of the licence, and the regulations from time to time affecting the same. Provided always that a licensee may pay the whole amount of the fee in advance in which case he shall not be called upon to furnish such bond.

Every dealer in Marine Stores shall also enter into such a bond as is referred to in Regulation 8 for every collector, who applies for a licence through him.

2. Every dealer in Marine Stores shall have his name with the words "Dealer in Marine Stores" painted distinctly in letters not less than 3½ inches long on a board to be hung up conspicuously in front of each of his registered premises.

3. Any such shop may only be open from the 1st October to 31st March from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. and from 1st April to 30th September from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m.

4. No Marine Stores shall be purchased from a child apparently under 14 years of age.

5. Every such licensee shall keep books in the form and manner hereinafter shown in Form A or in such other form as the Governor may direct and shall enter therein the name of every person from whom he purchases any articles, the house number, name of street and district in which such person dwells together with an intelligible description of the articles and time at which it was sold with the price paid therefor, and he shall also attach the number of purchase to each article which is \$3 or more in value.

6. No trade or business other than that of a dealer in Marine Stores shall be carried on in any shop licensed under these regulations, and no provisions of any kind shall be dealt in or bought or sold by a dealer in Marine Stores, in the course of his business.

### Marine Stores Collectors.

7. The annual licence fee payable by a Marine Stores Collector shall be five dollars per annum, payable in advance, and the dealer in Marine Stores through whom such hawker applies for a licence shall enter into a bond for \$100 for the performance and observance by such collector of the conditions of such licence, and of the regulations affecting the same, and of the provisions of the Marine Stores Protection Ordinance, 1919.

A Marine Stores Collector's Licence shall be issued only to an individual person, and shall bear, on the face thereof, (*inter alia*) the date of the issue thereof and the name, and place of birth of the person to whom such licence is issued, and the date of expiration of such licence, which particulars shall be written in English and Chinese. Such licence shall also bear on the face thereof a photograph of the licensee.

The conditions of a Marine Stores Collector's Licence shall be as follows, and shall be printed, on the back of the Licence in English and Chinese—

1. This licence is not transferable.
2. The Licence Board must be kept exhibited in a conspicuous manner in some conspicuous place on the body of the licensee.
3. Every licensee shall produce two copies of his photograph, one to be deposited in the Office of the Captain Superintendent of Police and the other to be affixed to his licence.
4. The licensee shall not ply the trade of a Marine Stores Collector nor shall he be afloat on the harbour for any purpose between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.
5. The licensee shall not be entitled to sell but shall only be entitled to buy marine stores, and, as regards buying marine stores, shall only be entitled to buy marine stores (which term does not include provisions) of the same kind or kinds as the dealer, who applied for the licensee's licence, deals in.
6. Every licensee failing to comply with any of the above conditions, or convicted of any offence, is liable to have his licence cancelled forthwith by the Captain Superintendent of Police.
