At the commencement of Peace Celebrations on the 19th July, the following resolution was passed by the Executive and Legislative Councils:—

The Executive and Legislative Councils assembled in joint session, on behalf of the people of the Colony of Hongkong, desire to tender to His Majesty the KING a humble expression of their loyalty and devotion, and their respectful and heartfelt congratulations on the attainment, in conjunction with the Allied and associated Powers, of a just and victorious peace. It is their fervent hope that the whole Empire, united by bonds of mutual sympathy and self-sacrifice, is about to enter on a new era of progress and prosperity.

I should be glad if this resolution may be submitted to His Majesty.
