Time Signals.

Commencing with January 1st, 1920, the Time Ball on Kowloon Signal Hill will be dropped daily at 10 a.m. (120th Meridian Time) instead of at 1 p.m.

It will also be dropped at 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays. On Saturdays it will be dropped at 1 p.m. instead of at 4 p.m.

The Ball will be hoisted half mast at the 55th minute and full mast at the 57th minute.

Should the Time Ball be out of order the above routine will be carried out with the flag "Z", on the Storm Signal mast.

Time Signals will also be given at night by means of three white lamps mounted vertically on the Observatory wireless mast. From 8^h 56^m 0^s to 9^h 0^m 0^s p.m. (120th Meridian Time) the lamps will be extinguished momentarily at the even seconds, except at the 2nd, 28th, 50th, 52nd and 54th of each minute.

MAGISTRACY.
