And whereas all the members of the Volunteer Reserve were so enrolled by proclamation on the 6th day of August 1914 :

And whereas it appears to me that the necessity for such enrolment has ceased :

Now Therefore I Sir REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same do hereby cancel the said enrolment as from and after the 31st day of December 1919.
